- Committed to seeing people impacted by Jesus.
- Committed to offering a place for people to connect with God and each other.
- Committed to being there for people as they navigate the different seasons of life.



Along the way, we are here for you. We want to equip you, encourage you, and empower you to become the leader God created you to be.

CREATING ATMOSPHERE

As leaders, the last ten percent of our preparation often becomes the first ten percent that people notice.

> As people come in to your Connect Group, they should be greeted by not only you, but by a sense of welcome - great smells, comfortable seating, and soft lighting. It is so important to create an atmosphere where people feel comfortable and safe to share. Although it may not seem like an important detail, these last adjustments can often be the tipping point that allows people to feel welcome, invited, and cared for in your group.

HERE ARE A FEW EASY WAYS TO CREATE A WELCOMING ATMOSPHERE AND FACILITATE A GREAT CONNECT GROUP EXPERIENCE:

TIDY UP

Whether you are an on-site group at the church, or in your own home, take pride in what your space looks like. Cleaning up a little bit will go a long way. Sometimes you might need to throw some things in a closet or spare room, and that's okay!

SET THE MOOD

Just like a coffee shop, we want to create a comforting atmosphere. Soft lighting and music will help put people at ease as they arrive and get settled. Providing food and coffee will also help break the ice as you start off your group.

PROVIDE ENOUGH SEATING

Having enough seats shows that you are prepared for the people in your Connect Group and makes them feel valued and welcome.

START AND END ON TIME

This shows people that you respect them and their time. The people who walk in late will realize quickly and won't want to miss out. A solid end time will give those who need to leave permission to go, and casual conversation can continue with those who would like to stay as you see fit.



LEADING A GREAT DISCUSSION

Every Connect Group looks different, but there is a common thread in every Connect Group that sets it apart from any other gathering of people: a Christ-centered, meaningful, and encouraging discussion.

You don't need to have all the answers, in fact, you'll probably find that you're able to help people grow in their faith the most when you can stop talking and facilitate a discussion among your group.

HERE ARE A FEW THINGS TO TRY:

START WITH SOMETHING EASY

Break the ice with a game, a few laughs, or simple, surface-level conversation. This opens the door for your Connect Group members to participate at a deeper level later on in the conversation.

ASK FOLLOW-UP QUESTIONS

Pay attention to what your Connect Group members are saying and don't be afraid to ask for more details. Though most people rarely share the full depth of their feelings at first, your follow-up questions give them permission to fully express their thoughts.

ALLOW ROOM FOR SILENCE

Give your questions some time to breathe. Silence can give your Connect Group members time to gather their thoughts and find a way to honestly approach a challenging subject.

FOLLOW THE RABBIT TRAIL (SOMETIMES)

Allow the Holy Spirit to guide your discussion by following your Connect Group's answers, even if they seem slightly off topic. Use your instincts and allow the Holy Spirit to speak through you about anything your Connect Group is dealing with.

END WITH ENCOURAGEMENT

Wherever your discussion leads, offer an uplifting insight, thought, or action step that will give your Connect Group members the hope they need to continue through the rest of the week.



CONNECTING WITH PEOPLE

The intention of a Connect Group is to help make a big church feel small. People can often feel lost in the crowd if they are not connected in a smaller group of people that they know and trust. As a Connect Group host, you are meant to bridge that gap and create a space where connection happens.

HERE ARE SOME SIMPLE WAYS TO CONNECT WITH YOUR GROUP:

INVITE PEOPLE INTO YOUR WORLD

Investing into people's lives by including them in yours is one of the easiest ways to stay connected. When people know your story, they feel closer to you. When they know what is happening in your life, they know how to pray and support you. As a Connect Group host, if you open up, people will follow.

INITIATE CHURCH ATTENDANCE TOGETHER

We know that a healthy soul comes from spending time leaning into God. Be encouraging your group to attend and volunteer at church. This is when connecting people and growing faith are integrated. Why not make it fun and volunteer on a Sunday or at an event together as a group!

• STAY UP TO DATE

Create a space (group text, Facebook message/group, etc.) where you can communicate as a group. This allows people to share praise reports, ask for prayer, or simply just chat. This will create a sense of belonging for your group members.

WHO IS IN YOUR GROUP?

If people are communicating, they are a contributing member of your group. Just because someone isn't attending every week doesn't mean they aren't engaging. Sometimes people have a hard time committing to every week (especially at the start). Don't be discouraged by this. If people are contributing, make an effort to keep them in your group.





Everyone who comes into your group has a different story. Some may have been believers their whole lives, while some may be new believers or may not even believe yet. As a Connect Group host, you get to learn your group members' stories and help them decide what their next step should be. Just like Jesus does with us, meet them where they are at and go from there.

We know we are winning when people are taking their next steps.

BECOMING A CONNECT GROUP HOST

Someone will most likely rise up naturally during your group, and their next step may be to become a Connect Group host themselves. The person you want to lose the least is likely the person you need to lose the most because they are already showing signs o fleadership in your group. Recognizing this next step for someone opens up an opportunity for others to connect with people and to grow their faith.

- Send everyone the meeting location.
- \Box Use balloons to help people find your place.
- \Box Prepare a few snacks.
- ☐ Clean up a little bit, or at least throw everything in a closet.
- Arrange seating to help people hear and see each other.
- \Box Play some soft music in the background.
- Put out name tags. This will help you get to know each other!

CORE PRACTICE

WE ARE ON MISSION

 \Box Pray that God would move this semester.

FLOW OF THE NIGHT:

• HANG OUT (15-25 MINS)

Welcome people as they arrive. Get to know your group as people grab coffee and snacks.

DISCUSSION (40-60 MINUTES)

Watch the video or review the group material. Use the provided discussion questions and facilitate conversation.

PRAY (5 MINUTES)

Finish by praying together as a group and/or taking prayer requests from your Connect Group members so you can pray for each other throughout the week.



FEEDBACK

It is important that we hear how your Connect Group is doing so we can continue to support you and improve our systems on a regular basis.

HERE ARE SOME WAYS TO KEEP US UPDATED:

FEEDBACK REPORT

Each week that your Connect Group takes place, you will be sent a link via text message that will contain a report to fill out. It only takes a minute or less to fill out, helps us keep a record of attendance, and lets us know if and how we can assist you. We want to hear how you think we can improve Connect Groups as well! Don't be afraid to offer your suggestions or to ask for help.





We value how you are doing as a host and want to support you the best that we can. We have created a team of Care Leaders who are here to assist your needs as a host on a more personal level.

The Care Leader's role is to support you in caring for your group members and to supply you with resources when needed. Think of them as a Connect Group leader of Connect Group leaders.
