Loop Show Likes You 1 Week: Face Painting

Who Said It?

For this activity, students will use their biblical knowledge to guess whether a quote is from the Bible or not!

Activity Objective

Vote if the quote you hear is in the Bible or not by moving to one side of the room or the other.

You'll Need

Who Said It? activity supplement (1 sheet per group)

Instructions

Note: This game can be led by one leader, such as your emcee.

- 1. Students **stand** in the middle of your room.
- 2. **Say:** It can be really hard to know if something you hear is from the Bible or not. There's a ton of truth out there that isn't a direct quote from the Bible, of course. But—there's also stuff out there that sounds true, but really isn't God's truth. Let's play a game to see if you can figure out if you're hearing something from the Bible or not! I'm going to read a quote to you. If you think it's from the Bible, you'll walk to this side of our room. (*Point to one side of your room.*) If you think it's not from the Bible, you'll walk to the other side of the room. (*Point to the other side of your room.*)
- 3. Read a statement from the Who Said It? activity supplement.
- 4. Help students vote if it's from the Bible or not by moving to the appropriate side of the room.
- 5. Read the answer.
- 6. Celebrate with kids who got it right. Be sensitive to students who didn't. Let them know this is a very tricky game that's just for fun!
- 7. Reset by having all students return to the middle of the room.
- 8. Repeat steps 3-7 as time allows.
- 9. If you have time remaining, ask these questions:
 - Which quote was the trickiest?
 - Which quote was the funniest?
 - Which quote surprised you?
 - What's your favorite quote that's not in the Bible?
